212 BULLYING

A. PURPOSE

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1. The Carbon Lehigh Intermediate Unit Board of Directors is committed to providing a safe, positive learning environment for students. The Board recognizes that bullying creates an atmosphere of fear and intimidation, detracts from the safe environment necessary for student learning, and may lead to more serious violence. Therefore, the Board prohibits bullying by students. This policy pertains to CLIU operated facilities outside of the fourteen member school districts. CLIU classroom programs located in school districts' buildings will follow the bullying policy of the district where the program is located.

B. DEFINTIONS

- 1. Bullying means an intentional electronic, written, verbal or physical act or series of acts directed at another student or students, which occurs in a school setting, and/or outside a school setting, that is severe, persistent or pervasive and has the effect of doing any of the following as determined by the administration of the Carbon Lehigh Intermediate Unit 21:
 - Substantially interfering with a student's education.
 - Creating a threatening school environment.
 - Substantially disrupting the orderly operation of the school.
- 2. Cyber-bullying means an intentional electronic act or series of acts, through the utilization of computers, the Internet, interactive and digital technologies, or electronic devices that are directed at another student or students, which occurs in a school setting, and/or outside a school setting, that is severe, persistent or pervasive and has the effect of doing any of the following as determined by the administration of the Carbon Lehigh Intermediate Unit 21:
 - Substantially interfering with a student's education.
 - Creating a threatening school environment.
 - Substantially disrupting of the orderly operation of the school.
- 3. School setting means in the school, on school grounds, in school vehicles, at a designated bus stop or at any activity sponsored, supervised or sanctioned by the school. This includes acts that occur outside the school setting as long as the acts meet the standards set forth in school code.

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36 C. AUTHORITY

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- 1. Bullying, as defined in this policy, includes cyber bullying and electronic harassment.
- 2. The Board encourages students who have been bullied to promptly report such incidents to the Supervisor, Teacher, designee, or any other professional staff member.
 - 3. Complaint Process
 - Students and parents/guardians should make all reports to a Supervisor, Teacher, designee, or any other professional staff member. Staff should inform an appropriate supervisor when they receive complaints of harassment or bullying.
 - 4. The Board directs that complaints of bullying shall be investigated promptly, and corrective action shall be taken when allegations are verified.

D. DELEGATION OF RESPONSIBILITY

- 1. Each student shall be responsible for respecting the rights of others and to ensure an atmosphere free from bullying.
- 50 2. The Director or designee shall develop administrative regulations to implement this policy.
- 51 3. The Director or designee shall ensure that this policy and administrative regulations are reviewed annually with students.
 - 4. The Director or designee, in cooperation with other appropriate administrators, shall review this policy every three (3) years and recommend necessary revisions to the Board.

E. GUIDELINES

- 1. Intermediate Unit administration shall annually provide the following information with the Safe School Report:
 - a. Board Policy #212,
 - b. Report of bullying incidents, and
- 61 c. Information on the development and implementation of any bullying prevention, intervention or educational programs.
 - 2. The Code of Student Conduct, which shall contain this policy, shall be disseminated annually to students.
- 3. This policy shall be accessible in every classroom. This policy shall be posted in a prominent location within each CLIU operated classroom building.
